1. School Overview

Logos is an independent school, registered with the WCED and fully accredited by Umalusi, and is also registered as a Non-Profit Organisation with the Department of Social Development and as a Public Benefit Organisation with SARS.

We currently have 168 students from Grade R to Grade 12, which is 11 more than last year, and 23 more than in 2024. Growth always brings both opportunity and responsibility, and we are grateful for both.

Our team consists of 20 qualified, SACE-registered teaching staff who are, supported by 8 administrative staff. Thank you to the amazing Logos team, a committed and collaborative group who supports one another, works with unity of purpose and contributes to a positive and uplifting school environment.

2. Academic Progress

Matric results are not only a reflection of the school's standard, but also a culmination of consistent hard work and dedication from both staff and students. The Class of 2025 certainly upheld this tradition.

They achieved a 100% pass rate and a 100% Bachelor's pass – an outstanding accomplishment!



Jandr  Perold achieved the top mark in Computer Applications Technology in the province and was honoured at a prestigious WCED awards event. He also received an award from the Cape Winelands Municipality for achieving first position in our school.



Raynell van Reenen followed closely with an exceptional achievement, obtaining the second-highest mark in Afrikaans First Additional Language in the Western Cape.



Currently, students are busy with assessments. Reports will be available after the holidays, as some assessments are still being written this week. Thereafter, results go through a thorough process of marking, moderation, and analysis. Reports will be issued by 17 April at the latest.

We are getting ready for the Langeberg Indoor Hockey Tournament that will commence in term 2. Grade 7 will also continue their field hockey during the winter.



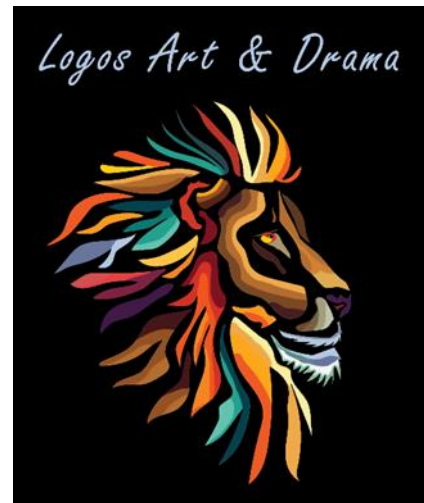
✓ **Soccer** (Grades 8–12 Boys)

4. Student Development

Each day at Logos begins with devotions, including Bible study and prayer. 5. Update on Building Project

The second phase of the Logos High School building expansion has commenced.

In Phase 1, the double-storey classroom block was completed and has been in use since January 2024. Renovations to the adjacent older building are now underway. Electrical work has been completed, walls are currently being strengthened and repaired, and the floor will soon be reinforced.

Once completed, this space will include a computer lab, additional classrooms, dedicated high school bathrooms, and a cafeteria – giving the building a completely renewed purpose and appearance.

We have successfully raised sufficient funds for Phase 2. We kindly ask that you continue to keep this project in your prayers as we trust for provision to complete all phases.



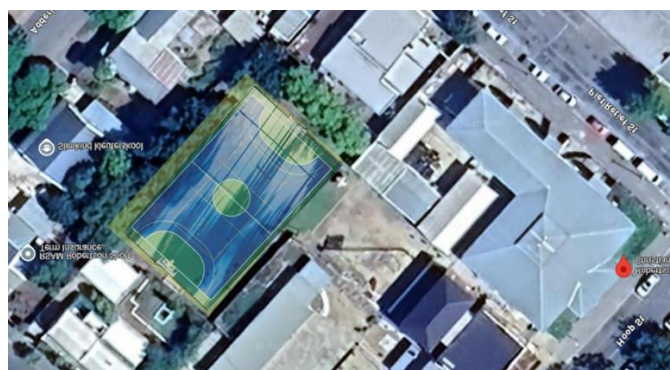
